

SIX REGION REPORT

Each region has more than twenty SDSBA participating churches, with many others that are welcome to join. Churches are Kingdom entities designed to make a spiritual and societal impact. Imagine, in the case of war, if these regions contained 20-50 military outposts in each region -- how powerful and effective! But, churches are not military outposts but coalitions of community residents from all walks of life. Their community is vital to them. It is where their children and grandchildren live, work, and go to school. And the churches in each region, working together, serving the communities, can make a decisive contribution. After all, churches, following the example of Jesus, understand the importance of serving others. Jesus taught, the greatest among you must be the servant of all.





TWO STRATEGIES

First is a BOUNDED SET strategy.

A bounded set means that leaders in the same region share a joint call from God within the exact geographical location. A monthly gathering allows pastors and leaders in the same area to connect, problem-solve, fellowship, pray, and share a meal.

The second is a CENTERED SET strategy.

A centered set is simply a group of people that share a common concern or affinity. An example would be adults working with elementary third graders to help them learn to read at their grade level. Reading skill is crucial to the well-being of students and society. Up until the third grade, a child learns to read. From the third grade on, a child is reading to learn. Helping children with reading skills is something that many people care about, especially parents who want their children to get a good education to get a good job when they grow up. The strategy to assist churches is now called **All San Diego.**

Advancing the Gospel

1. SEND NETWORK PARTNERSHIP

We enter our Twelfth year with the North American Mission Board (NAMB) and California Southern Baptist Convention (CSBC) as a "Send City". This partnership provides personnel such as Jeremy Aylett, David Godoy, Michael Jimenez, and Chase Feindel, funded by our North American Mission Board (NAMB) to assist in planting new churches.

2. SEND RELIEF PARTNERSHIP

Plans are underway for a Send Relief Ministry Tour in February 2025. We will bring teams from across the USA to work with our Churches in a Day of Service. Send Relief is committed to partnering with our San Diego Churches and regions **in five focus areas**.

FOCUS AREAS

Strengthen Communities.

Serving the needs of each communities in each region where we have a churches.

Care for Refugees.

San Diego is both a border city and a port city. Refugees present real human needs. Often, refugees enter a country with few resources and unable to speak, read or understand the language. They arrive with tremendous dreams, but their needs leave them vulnerable to manipulation and abuse.

Protect Children and Families.

In San Diego, the need for foster and adoptive families has never been greater. Often, lives are touched by drug and alcohol use, abuse, neglect, disease and poverty. Send Relief can help you and your church demonstrate unconditional love, support gospel reconciliation and help biological, foster and adoptive families thrive through a Family Advocacy Ministry.

· Fight Human Trafficking.

They are in your community and around the world. They are often hidden in plain sight. The Enemy is indiscriminate and preys on the strong and vulnerable alike. But there is hope!

Ministry to victims and survivors can be complex, but Send Relief is here to help you and your church fight for freedom—both physical and spiritual.

Respond to Crisis.

When responding to disasters, our primary partner is Southern Baptist Disaster Relief. Across all fifty states, thousands of volunteers respond when a crisis hits, quickly providing assistance ranging from serving hot meals to helping families clean up after a storm.

3. HISPANIC CHURCHES

Our largest ethnic group of churches in San Diego is Hispanic. Our SDSBA Hispanic Fellowship is organized to serve it's culture. Training and fellowship events are sponsored for our Hispanic speaking churches.

4. DISCIPLESHIP AND MISSIONS

D-Groups. Judy Carlisle, Director of Ministry Operations, Discipleship, and Missions, in 2019 launched a new emphasis assisting churches with Discipleship and increased Missions involvement with Mexico and the International Mission Board. Thirty-two SDSBA Churches began a new D-Group Ministry.

5. COMMUNICATIONS

6. NEW CHURCHES

San Diego.

Ten churches were added in 2023. In partnership with NAMB, and CSBC. Please pray for our new churches as they seek to reach out and grow.

Mexico.

Planted **4** new churches in Mexico with our SDSBA Mexico Missionary, Juvenal Gonzalez. Juvenal continues to serve and provide training for more than 40 churches in Mexico with a focus on discipleship.

7. PARTY TRAILERS AND PORTABLE BAPTISTERY

The Association has three fully supplied party trailers for our churches that has provided financial support in the previous 12 months at a very low cost. Each trailer is supplied with cotton candy machine, snow cone machine, popcorn machine, video and audio sound equipment, inflatable bounce house for children, along with electrical generators, easy-up tents, and much more.

A portable Baptistery is available upon request for participating churches.

8. MINISTRY COACHING

Many coaching resources are available to churches, pastors, and ministry leaders. This includes



God has blessed us with outstanding performance in these areas over the past several years. I am grateful to report that He is allowing our staff to continue their excellent work in 2023. Here are some of the highlights of our work as we partner with you to resource the Great Commission.

In 2022 we distributed more than \$13 million to our partners to help them resource the Great Commission. Through July 31, 2023, we have distributed more than \$7.7 million to our partners, putting us on pace to exceed 2022 distributions.

The Foundation's total assets under management grew to more than \$216 million as of December 31, 2022. Despite the fluctuating economy, our assets under management increased to \$230 million as of July 31, 2023. God is blessing our work in remarkable ways, and we are grateful.

Our lending team assisted dozens of churches in 2022 providing more than \$32 million for property acquisition, renovations, and new construction. Loan demand from churches remains healthy in 2023. However, production is reduced due to rising interest rates, tightness in the financial markets, and an increase we made in our reserves to further safeguard investors. Our team anticipates closing about \$10 million by year end and continues to consult and advise churches with financing and facility needs.

Our legal team has conducted Estate Planning seminars in more than 25 churches and anticipates completing over 35 seminars by year end. We encourage Baptists to bless their families and provide resources for their local church and our Baptist entities through biblical estate planning. We have already exceeded our 2023 goal of \$5 million in estate planning pipeline gifts to Southern Baptist causes with \$6 million already in the pipeline this year. Nearly one-third of these planned gifts will go directly to local CSBC churches. We

offer free estate planning services to Lead Pastors who encourage their congregations in this area by hosting an estate planning seminar. We would love to plan a seminar for your church to encourage your congregants to leave a Christian legacy to resource the Great Commission.

We are celebrating 10 years of SoCal Baptist Ministries. By the end of 2023, SoCal Baptist Ministries will have given away \$7 million through 1500 grants to California Southern Baptist Churches for evangelism and outreach. This ministry was created through an endowment gift to The Baptist Foundation and had a 10-year lifespan built into the agreement. Beginning in 2024, as SoCal Baptist Ministries transitions, there will be some changes. Our CSBC entities will begin receiving annual funding from this endowment and as a result there will be a reduction in funds available for granting. 2024 will provide two grant periods instead of four and the eligibility guidelines have been updated. Please refer to bfcal.org/grants for specific details. We celebrate all that God has done in the last ten years through this incredible Kingdom resource and look forward to God using this endowment for Kingdom work in the future.

SoCal Baptist Ministries is a great example of the long-lasting impact of endowments. That is why we created four new endowments in 2022 to benefit four of our key partners and seeded those endowments with \$70,000 each for a total of \$280,000. Through investment earnings and additional contributions from our partners, these endowments have already grown to a total of more than \$400,000 in less than a year's time. We anticipate providing significant additional funding to each of those endowments by year end again. We want to bless our partners: CBU, CSBC, Gateway, and Mission:Dignity as God blesses us. As our partners continue to invest resources with us and God's blessings remain on our work, we will be faithful to provide additional funding for His work.

Our ministry clearly has a financial focus, but it is also about the people God has called us to serve. Every morning our team meets together and prays specifically for several pastors and churches by name and sends a follow-up prayer card. We have prayed for every California Southern Baptist Convention (CSBC) pastor and church by name and our staff has personally visited with hundreds of pastors in the last twelve months. We continue to sponsor pastors and wives' events, gatherings, and retreats across our state. We love pastors and all our partners and commit to doing all we can to support the ministries God has called them to lead.
